Nomination Committee

The nomination committee of minimum 5 members will be comprised of:

- Two Autistic volunteers who have previous experience on not-for-profit boards and who do not intend to stand as Directors.
- One 2nd voice (Family Member) volunteer who has previous experience on not-for-profit boards and who does not intend to stand as a Director.
- One representative from The Sinneave Family Foundation.
- One representative from Autism Alliance of Canada.

Nomination and Election Process Overview

The nomination process will take place in 4 phases:

Applications selected for shortlist review will be slotted into voting matrix (see below) Shortlist is finalized by mid-September. Applicants notified. Bios for shortlist finalized. 	 Election information sent to members. Voting open until October 26. Votes tabulated and 15 Directors receiving the most votes identified. All candidates notified. Results of voting announced, and members formally endorse election results
